

# KEA Remote Learning Provision

At King's Ely Acremont, the remote curriculum mirrors and runs parallel to that taught in school.

We expect that remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take pupils broadly 3 hours each day, however, as with in school teaching, home school hours will often be more than this when tutor lessons, assemblies and other additional live touchpoints are included. These are optional.

Remote education will be received via links, embedded in emails, to learning apps, EyLog, recorded content, Power Point teaching presentations and live Zoom lessons. Learning packs have been sent to families at the start of lockdown and scheme reading books are available to collect from school, weekly. Work should be submitted via email, or the Eylog for Reception children, in order to receive feedback.

Children are expected to complete the identified core pieces of English and Maths and they will also receive challenge tasks and extension tasks, which are optional. Engagement with remote learning is monitored across the week based on activities completed and live sessions attended. Teachers will reach out to families in discussion with the Head of Section if core activities and attendance at class Zooms are not observed. Children will receive daily support, feedback and next steps.

Families with children with additional needs will be contacted individually by our Learning Support Coordinator to discuss and set-up appropriate tailored support.

If a key worker child is self-isolating they will receive the same provision as those learning remotely. If a child is self-isolating during a period of full 'in class' teaching, they will receive a range of learning opportunities from the curriculum taught in class, including Zoom class pastoral meetings.
